[Adult Disability Payment - ADP](#)

This is the Scottish Government agency that administers devolved benefits in Scotland (like Adult Disability Payment, Child Disability Payment, Carer Support Payment, etc.). They provide guidance on what benefits exist, who's eligible, and how to apply. You can contact them for advice on eligibility and applications by phone or webchat

Independent advocacy support helps disabled people access benefits with Social Security Scotland, explaining options, how to apply, and supporting communication with the agency. As of early 2026, this service is transitioning to Advice Direct Scotland as the main advocacy provider

Scotland's largest independent advice network. Their trained advisers can help you figure out what benefits you may be eligible for, how work affects benefits, and assist with applications or appeals.
